1. Introduction and apologies

2. Revision to the minutes

No revisions to the minutes of the 2018 AGM were proposed. The minutes were approved.

3. Chair's report (SLIDES 2-6)

The Chair reported that the responsibility for membership management has changed from Dovetail to Mosaic Events (see slide 2). The Chair thanked Dovetail for their support throughout the years. The Membership Secretary confirmed that the handover had been very smooth.

A re-designed website for BAAL was launched in February 2019 (see slide 3). The Chair thanked Richard Smith (BAAL Web Editor) and the team at Mosaic for their support in curating and launching the site. Changes/updates to the BAAL Wikipedia page are in progress.

The Chair reported that a REF 2021 consultation document was submitted in October 2018. The document is now available on the BAAL website.

An ESRC consultation document was submitted by the Chair in August 2018. The document will be uploaded to the BAAL website soon.

The Chair announced the good news that the Applying Linguistics Fund will continue to offer a total of £10,000 of funding to approved projects (see slide 4 for more information on the above items).

Since the last AGM, the Chair reported that they have represented BAAL on a number of other committees (slide 5), including:

- AILA (International Association of Applied Linguistics)
- AcSS (Academy of Social Sciences)
- UCGAL (University Council of General and Applied Linguistics)
- British Academy

The journal *Applied Linguistics* (current Editors: Anna Mauranen and Christina Higgins, Reviews and Forum Editor: Zhu Hua) continues to have an acceptance rate of 20 per cent. The average time to first decision has been shortened to 29 days (see slide 6).

The Chair ended their update by thanking colleagues who have been supportive during this first year in the role. Particular thanks were extended to Caroline Tagg and Tess Fitzpatrick (previous Chair), whose support and advice has been much appreciated.

4. Competition for visual representations of multilingualism (SLIDES 7-8)

Zhu Hua reported on this competition, which is part of BAAL's initiative to increase multilingual representation in BAAL and beyond. The competition was run in partnership with CuratorSpace, Multilingual Matters, and the AILA Research Network for Creative Inquiry and Applied Linguistics. There were over 90 entries from artists and creative practitioners internationally.

1st prize was awarded to *Light and Language* by Linda Persson, with Wongatha women Geraldine Hogarth and Luxie Redmond-Hogarth, and parts of the community of Leonora, Desert of Eastern Goldfields Australia. 2nd prize was awarded to *(Inter)weaving repertoires* by Gail Prasad. 3rd prize was awarded to *Languages: Time Dreams Avatars* by Elina Karadzhova.

Conference attendees were encouraged to visit 'The Cave', where the shortlisted works could be viewed throughout the conference.
